Véronique Nah is a musician, actress, and director. For her forty-year career, she has integrated musical techniques with theatrical and performance practices on stage and conducted workshops and training sessions.

Born in Montreal, Canada, she has been living in Florence since '86, when she joined the theater company Piccoli Principi. Her partnership with the founder Alessandro Libertini includes more than 3000 performances in Europe and worldwide: Italy, France, Belgium, Netherlands, Germany, Austria, Switzerland, Portugal, Spain, Israel, Finland, Russia, Romania, Canada, and India. She has worked on numerous art projects for national and international institutions, including Teatro alla Scala in Milan, the Royal Palace of Naples, Musée d'Orsay in Paris, the Contemporary Art Biennale of Lyon, Bozar/Palais des Beaux-Arts in Brussels, General Academic State Puppet Theatre Serghei Obraztsov in Moscow, and the Kolkata Centre for Creativity in Kolkata.
